Key Vocab and Glossary

Mediterranean: From the Latin meaning 'middle of the land'.

Equator: An imaginary line around the 'middle' of the earth. The sun's rays hit the equator directly, making places located near to it very warm.

Climate: The long term pattern of weather conditions.

Physical features: Natural features of the Earth's surface e.g. rivers, mountains, coasts, canyons, peninsulas.

Human features: Features built by humans e.g. buildings, roads, bridges

Peninsula: A region of land that sticks out in a body of water, with water on three sides

Inhabit: To live or dwell in a place

Population: The whole number of people living in a country, city or area

Currency: money used in a country

Migrant: a person who moves from one place to another, especially to find work or better living conditions.

Retail: selling goods to the public

Service industry: creates services but isn't involved in manufacturing e.g. banking, restaurants, tradesmen.

Tourism: spending time away from home to relax or for pleasure whilst making use of the service industry.

Vegetation belt: an area with distinct plant types determined by soil, climate, drainage and elevation.
