Attendance

As some of you will be aware we have recently sent out letters in regards to attendance to children who have attendance lower than 90%. This is something that we will be monitoring carefully over the next year. The government have recently released guidance which states-

Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school. The government expects schools and local authorities to:

- promote good attendance and reduce absence, including persistent absence
- ensure every pupil has access to full-time education to which they are entitled
- act early to address patterns of absence
- parents to perform their legal duty by ensuring their children of compulsory school age who are registered at school attend regularly
- all pupils to be punctual to their lessons
