In order to ensure

Key Symptoms to look out for

- New, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss of, or change to sense of smell or taste (anosmia)

What to do if your child starts to experience one or more symptoms

Day 0: Symptoms appear

You must arrange a test for your child immediately. Your household and support bubble must self-isolate.

Test results are negative

Your child can return to school if they are otherwise feeling well ehough. If they are not well enough to attend school, regular absence procedures will now be followed.

Test results are positive

Your child must self isolate for 10 days from day 0 (when symptoms first appeared) They cannot attend school during this time. The rest of the household must self isolate for 14 days. If they are well enough school work will be provided.

Day 10: If your child no longer has a temperature and they are otherwise feeling well enough they can return to school. A cough and no sense of smell or taste may last for several weeks. If your child still has a termperature they should continue to self isolate.

What to do if someone in your child's household or support bubble start to experience one or more symptoms.

Day 0: Symptoms appear

The person showing symptoms must arrange a test immediately. Your household, child and support bubble must self-isolate. Whilst waiting for results we will organise for remote learning to take place.

Test results are negative

Your child can return to school.

Test results are positive

Your child must self isolate for 14 days from day 0 (when symptoms first appeared) When you contact school, we will organise for remote learning to take place.

Your child develops

symptoms: You must arrange a test for your child immediately. Your child should continue to self isolate.

Your child does not develop any symptoms

Your child may return to school after the 14 days isolation period.

Your Child's test results are negative

Your child should continue to self isolate until the end of the 14 day period. After this time, they may return to school provided they have not developed any more symptoms.

Your child's test results are positive

Your child must self isolate for 10 days from when their symptoms first appeared. This may be longer than their initial self isolation period of 14 days.

Day 10: Your child no longer has a temperature

If your child no longer has a temperature and they are otherwise feeling well enough they can return to school. A cough and no sense of smell or taste may last for several weeks.

Day 10: Your child still has a temperature

Your child should continue to self isolate and seek medical attention if the have a high temperature for more than 5 days.
