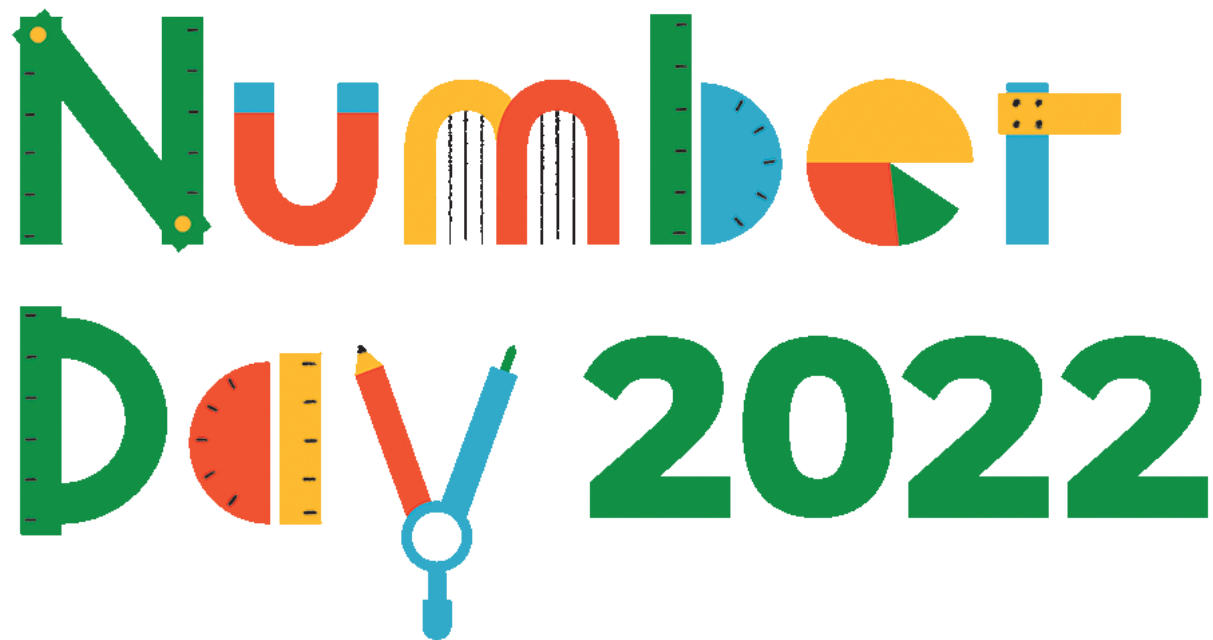
[Covid update](#)
