Covid Guidelines

Just a reminder that guidance has not changed for COVID testing in schools. We know there are a lot of colds and other bugs going around at the moment; however, if your child has a new cough, high temperature or loss of taste or smell please make sure that they have a PCR test before returning to school. Do not assume it is just a cold. Cases are rising at an incredible rate and we want to make sure that we keep all children, staff and parents safe.

If you are identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive please book a PCR test. Lateral flow tests should not be used on children under the age of 11 as they are not accurate for them.
